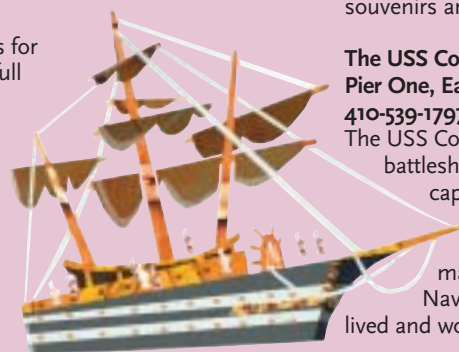

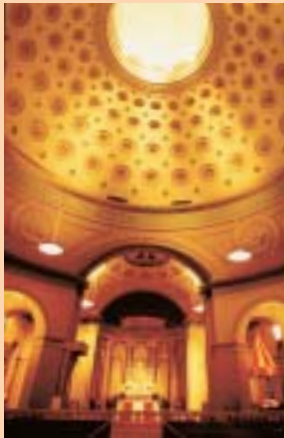

During the War of 1812, the successful defense of this star-shaped fort inspired Francis Scott Key to pen the words to "The Star-Spangled Banner," which became our national anthem.

The nation's first and most comprehensive wax museum of African American history and culture has more than 150 life-size, lifelike wax figures displayed in dramatic historical scenes.

The Sanctuary was erected in 1889, by Charles C. Cassell, architect, becoming home to the Greek Orthodox Church in 1937. Divine Liturgy is at 10:00 a.m. on Sundays and tours are available upon request.

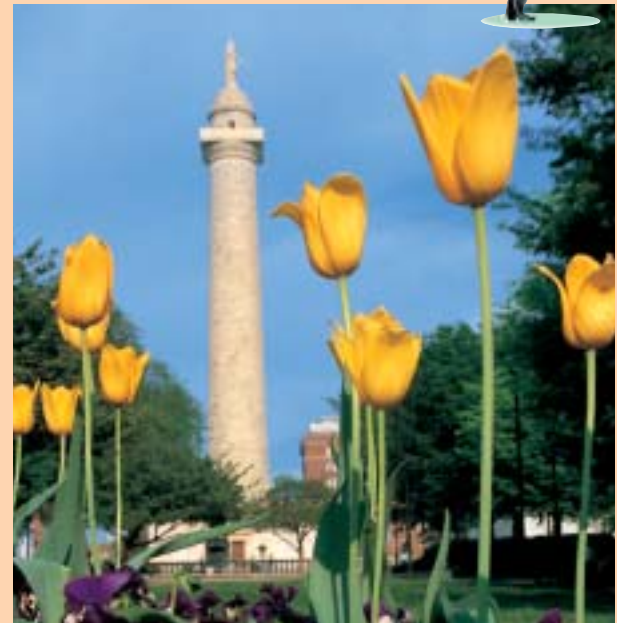

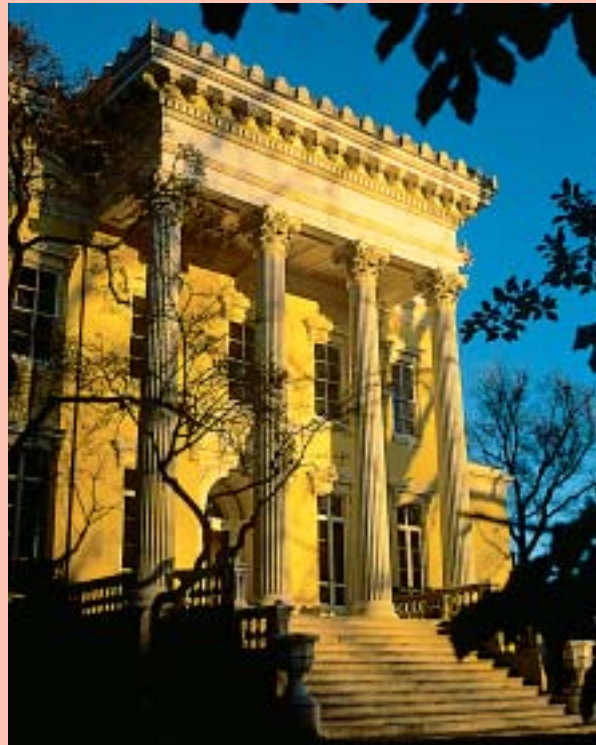

Evergreen House
